Scope

This scope of practice is as defined by the Australasian Chapter of Palliative Medicine.

The palliative care physician will be equipped to function effectively with the current and emerging professional, medical and societal contexts of palliative care as described by the Australasian Chapter of Palliative Medicine. It is expected that the Palliative Care Physician will have developed the clinical skills and theoretical knowledge for competent palliative medicine practice.

Position Objective

In consultation with the Manager of Clinical Services:

- To achieve service delivery goals through professional leadership to the multidisciplinary team, direct client care, planning, coordination and evaluation
- To provide consultant medical services in line with accepted standards of medical practice.
- To provide medical support to general practitioners, which supports and encourages them as primary medical provider of clients
- To work effectively as a member of an interdisciplinary team and actively participate in organisational committees and the wider community
- To deliver quality, holistic palliative care services that focus on the needs of clients and families

Key Responsibilities

Key result indicators

- Provide clinical leadership and support to clinical staff

Indicators**

- Participates in clinical meetings to review deaths, present new clients and review care plans
- Undertakes home visits at the request of the client, family, team member, or general practitioner
- Facilitate and participates in client/family care meetings as appropriate
- Provides specialist medical support to the clinical team, including telephone advice
- Undertakes effective liaison with medical practitioners, both general and specialists across settings
- Makes appropriate referral to services that will enhance client and family well being
- Participates in the assessment of the appropriateness of clients for admission to an in-patient facility
- Attends and participates in meetings to discuss clinical and professional issues

Indicators**

- Participates in organisational committees and the wider community
- Upholds the standards of confidentiality and privacy as required by PHH
- Contributes to consultancy and education sessions as required
- Upholds a professional manner to manage conflict and takes a resolution approach to achieving outcomes
- Participates in opportunities to reflect and explore issues and emotions that increase self-awareness
- Demonstrates ability to respond to other team members' needs for collegial emotional support, and feeds back on an informal basis
- Provides support and encouragement of self-care practices within team

- Maintains current client records and meets statistical reporting requirements

- Accepts responsibility for the supervision of tertiary students as delegated
- Reviews own work performance, identifying learning needs, and accesses opportunities for development
